

I, Jeremiah Powe of Southampton County being sick and weak of body but of sound mind and memory and viewing the uncertainty of this life think proper make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit:

I give and bequeath unto my brother Abraham Powe and his heirs forever all my plantation and lands hereafter supposed to be one hundred and sixteen acres to the same more or less, provided the said Abraham Powe payeth unto me by all my just debts and on the special condition the said Abraham Powe his heirs or assigns to enjoy the aforesaid land and premises as the three messes have been and accustomed throughout and all and every other part of my estate of what nature or kind whatever to him and his heirs forever I appoint my brother Abraham Powe my sole and sole executor to this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 11th day of September in the year eight hundred eleven.

I, Jeremiah Powe of Southampton County Virginia being weak in body but of sound mind and memory render thanks to God for the same do make and declare the following writing my last will and testament — Vizt.

I leave unto my living wife Rebecca Powe my mare until my son Sam Powe arrives to the age of twenty years. I also lend her the use and profits of one third part of my plantation and lands during her life and I give and bequeath unto my said wife twenty pounds cash and one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever —

I give and bequeath unto my son Lawrence Powe five dollars cash and all the property he already hath in proportion to him and his heirs forever — I give and divide and bequeath unto my son Isaac Powe all my lands and ~~subject~~ plantation subject to my wife's third part during her life one feather bed and furniture and my mare when he comes to the age of twenty years and to his heirs forever —

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Betty one bed and furniture. It is my will and desire that my executors hereafter named, sell my negro boy Emanuel and with the money arising from said sale pay off my proportion of all debt due to to grow due from Betty Larkfort to the Powe for which suit is instituted in Southampton County court and for which claim the negroes belonging to the said Elizabeth a
