Item I give and bequeath unto my two children namely Polly and Henry my other three negroes namely Dary Fanny and Isham (provided my said negro Emanuel should sell for enough to pay the claim of the Blows or my proportion thereof. if not a sufficient number of ^{said} slaves I leave to be sold to satisfy the balance of said claim and the remainder of said negroes to be equally divided between said Polly and Henry ^{and their heirs forever}.)

Item I leave the balance of my estate I give and bequeath unto my son Patrick Lowe ten pounds cash to him and his heirs forever.

Item I leave the balance of my estate to be sold executor herein after named and the money arising from said sale be applied to the discharge of my just debts and the remainder (if any) to be equally divided between all my children.

Lastly I do nominate and appoint Joshua Corbett my executor to the ^{my last will and testament} ~~my last will and testament~~ ^{null and void} ~~and~~ ^{and} ~~revoking and declaring void all other wills~~ heretofore by me made.
