Item I leave my goods and chattels all to be sold by my executors except the two beds already given away, and the proceeds to be divided between my two sons Jeremiah and Joseph Barnes in the following manner —

Item I give and bequeath unto Jeremiah Barnes ten dollars to him and his heirs forever, and in consequence of his having nearly completed his education and will be but very little more expence, his my desire for it to be understood on his mind that it is the only cause why I did not equalize him with my other children —

Item As my son Joseph Barnes is but yet my child and has no education and of course will take all of his estate he'll get from his father, in order to make him equal with my other children, I give and bequeath the remainder of my estate to him and his heirs forever. I do hereby ordain and appoint my brother Andrew Barnes my whole executor to the my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this 8th day of January 1812.

At a court held for the county of Southampton the day of May 1812 This last will and testament of Martha Barnes deceased was the day fore-
said in court by John Davis the executor therein named proved by the oaths of
Jeremiah Boyce and Robert Byrne two of the justices thereof and ordered to be
recorded and on the motion of said executor who made oath according to law said
justice is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form on his ground
said and lawfully whereupon &c.

In the name of God Amen, I Joseph Boyce of the county of Southampton being
weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory thanks be to almighty God
for the same but calling to mind the uncertainty of this life and knowing that
it is appointed once for all men to die do make and publish this my last will and
testament in manner and form following.

Surprised, I give and bequeath unto my son John Boyce after marriage or death
of my beloved wife Hannah Boyce, the land as follows (to wit) beginning at
a white oak growing between Hannah's line thence down the quarter line to a corner
opposite to the brick chimney of the great house, thence a straight line across between
between the said house and chimney to my line on the other side and all
my land and plantation on the south of said crop line and at my death on
young black man one gun and ten pounds cash to be raised out of my estate
to him and his heirs forever
