In the Name of God Amine, I Jacob Barnes being sick in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for the same, and knowing that is once appointed for all men to die, do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner and form following to wit,

First of all I give and bequeath my sole to the almighty God who gave it me, and my body to be buried in a decent manner at the direction of my Executors.

Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Barnes one bed and furniture during her life, and after the death of my wife I give and bequeath it to my daughter Martha Barnes, I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Barnes all my stock of hogs household & kitchen furniture except what may be hereafter given to her during life, & at her death to my daughter Martha to her and her heirs forever.

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Peggy Barnes one bed and furniture one chest, sixty two acres of Land lying and adjoining Edgington Bogner Lands Barnabas Drakus dec^d Land Harts dec^d George Edwards formerly (now Benjamin Devanyp) to her and her heirs forever.

Fourthly— I give and bequeath unto my Elmsliea Jones, sixty two acres of land, adjoining the above sixty two acres, as also adjoining Ben^r Devanyp to her and her heirs forever. Fifthly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha Barnes, sixty two acres of land, adjoining the sixty two acres
