In the Name of God amen, I Joseph Loes of the County of Southampton and Parish of Netley, being sick and weak in body, but of a perfect sound mind and memory do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth, viz^t
 Item I lend unto my beloved wife Ann Loes the use of my plantation together with all the remains of Estate during her widowhood or life and at her death or marriage, I give unto my son Joseph Loes my land plantation where on I now live containing by estimation 55 acres be the same more or less, also one new ground and Plantation Netley, to him and his heirs forever
 Item I give unto my son John Loes one Cow and calf and ten pounds Cash to him and his heirs forever
 Item and it is my will and desire that at the death or marriage of my said wife that all the remains of my whole estate not above mentioned shall equally divided between my four daughters namely Sophia Polly Edmunds, Marrow Driver, & Nancy Harrison Loes, to them and their heirs forever but provided my wife should die before my youngest daughter should arrive to the age of seven years, it is my desire that there should be one much raised out my estate as may be thought sufficient to support her for that term of time
