I, Anne Darden of Southamptons County do make and  
 ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form  
 following viz<sup>t</sup> First Whereas James Britt, has promised  
 that provided that I would relinquish to him, all the  
 Interest which I have in a Negro man Tom belonging  
 to the estate of my eldest daughter, Dolly & Henry and he  
 would maintain me during my life, and would not after  
 my death claim any thing of my estate, for or on acc<sup>t</sup> of any  
 money which he has paid or may pay for me. Now if therefore  
 the said James Britt, shall comply with this his promise  
 I do in consideration thereof hereby give to him and his heirs forever  
 the interest which I have in the said Negro Tom but if he  
 should fail to comply with his promise during my life, or  
 shall after my death bring any acct. against my estate  
 for money paid for me or for services rendered, or for any  
 thing which he has furnished or may hereafter furnish towards  
 my support I then give the Interest, which I have in the  
 said Negro Tom to my son Elisha Darden to him and his  
 heirs forever. Item I give all the residue of my estate of all  
 and every kind whatsoever including the hire of Simon &  
 Charlotte the present year to my son Elisha Darden
