That the name of said account. I Joseph C. Mundell of Southampton County and State of Virginia being in a weak state of body but in Sound Mind (and memory) do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth— and as for my worldly goods when with God has that made I dispose of in manner and form here after named

First I give and bequeath to Stephen John Mundell one Negro boy named Tom to him and his heirs forever—
and Secondly I give and bequeath to David Cloud who lives white one one hundred dollars to him and his heirs forever—

Thirdly I give and bequeath to the same Negro boy Tom one hundred Dollars to him and his heirs forever to be left in the hands of James Jackson to pay to Tom at his discretion in the third way as to David Cloud

Fourthly it is my will and order that the balance of the money due me from James Jackson should be equally divided between my Nephews William and Thomas Mundell the sons of John Mundell to them and their heirs forever—

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my brother in law Mr. Kingston Ellis ten moun to him and his heirs forever—

Sixthly I give and bequeath to my brother John Mundell all the land that is in my title to him and his heirs forever—

Seventhly I give and bequeath to my niece Sarah Mundell the daughter of John Mundell all my household and kitchen furniture of all kind to her and her heirs forever—

Eighthly I give and bequeath to James Jackson my tobacco and Hog to him and his heirs forever— I do appoint my friend James Jackson to be my Executor as this my last will and Testament in the Presence of the
