In the name of God amere I Joseph C. Mundiell of Southampton County  
and State of Virginia living in a weak state of body but in sound mind  
and memory do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in  
manner and formes following and set forth for my worlds goods wher  
with god his blst me with I dispose of in manner and formes here  
after named

and first I give and bequeath to Nephew John Mundiell one Negro boy  
named Tom to him and his heirs forever  
and Secondly I give and bequeath to David Edwards who lives whith me one  
hundred dollars to him and his heirs forever

Thirdly I give and bequeath to the same Negro boy Tom one hundred Dollars  
to him and his heirs forever to be left in the hands of James Jackson to pay  
to Tom at his discretion in the sume way as to David Edwards

Fourthly it is my will and desire that the balances of the money due me  
from James Jackson should be equally divided between my Nephewes  
William and Thomas Mundiell the Sons of John Mundiell to them and  
their heirs forever

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my brother in Law Mr. M. Ellis two  
hundred dollars to him and his heirs forever

Sixthly I give and bequeath to my brother John Mundiell all the Goods  
that is now my Raibb to him and his heirs forever

Seventhly I give and bequeath to my nev Charlel Mundiell the daughter  
of John Mundiell all my household and kitchen furniture of all kinds to her  
and her heirs forever

Eighthly I give and bequeath to James Jackson my tobacco and Hogs to him  
(and his heirs forever) I do appoint my friend James Jackson to be my  
Executor to this my last will and Testament in the presence of the
