ninety pounds current Money of Virginia

Fifthly I give to my Nephew Benjamin Edwards Blunt the first choice
of my horses and the first choice of my Negro boys, that does not
meat off four years of age and the said Benjamin shall make
his own choice to him and his heirs forever

Sixthly I give to Henry R. Blunt son of Anne Delony the sum of five shillings
current Money of Virginia

Seventhly I give to Jobb Hazard, son of Phile Hazard the sum of five shillings
current Money of Virginia

Eighthly I give to my brother Benjamin Blunt all my lands and Plantations
lying and being in the county of Southampton and all my Negroes of
every description, not heretofore disposed of together with all the rest
and residue of my whole estate, not before given away, to him and his
heirs forever. It is my will and desire that my three Daughters
namely Pinks, Peg and Aggy should never be put under an
curfew, but to be well treated as long as they live and if either of
them should be disabled through age or infirmity, I request
that they may be taken care of & well supported by my estate

Ninthly I do constitute and appoint my beloved brother Benjamin
Blunt my whole and sole Executor of this my last will and Testament
and I also direct that my Executor shall not be compelled to give
Security for the Settlement of my estate shall not be apprised
