In the Name of God Amen I John Pope of
Southampton County being of Sound mind and memory and of
lawfull age, do hereby make and give this my last will and
testament as follows (to wit) I give and bequeath unto my
dear son, Pope all my right and title to or in the tract
of land whereof my father William Pope was seised,
and my other estate of what kind soever to him and his heirs
forever. I do hereby appoint John Bowers my Executor
to this my last will and testament, all others, In Witness whereof
I have set my hand and seal this 7th day of October
1812.

at a Court held for the County of
Mills ^{by} Hatfield ^{mark} Southampton the 15th day of November
1812. This Will was presented in Court by
John Bowers the Executor therein named provided by the Oath
of Care Bowers, Mills Hatfield and Simeon Obrey the Jurors
present and ordered to be recorded. On the Motion of the said Executor
who made Oath according to law Certificate is granted him
for obtaining a probat thereof in due form on his giving
bond and Security wherefor.
