I John Bottow of Southampton County being in good health and of  
sound mind & memory & knowing the uncertainty of this life do therefore  
propre to make and ordain this my last will & testament in manner  
and form as follows to wit

I give and bequeath to my niece Emmy Potts one Negro girl named Anna  
and one feather bed and furniture to her and to her heirs forever

I give and bequeath unto my nephew Stephen Potts one Negro boy  
named Abraham to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to Polly Atkinson daughter of William Atkinson  
one Negro girl named Mary and one Negro boy named Bob to  
her and her heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my brother Settlerby Bottow ten Dollars  
to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my cousin Joshua Temple fifty dollars to him  
and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my brother Devery Bottow my Plantations and  
all my lands therunto belonging one Negro man James and one  
Carpenter one Negro man James and one Negro woman named  
Anna and one Negro boy Jerry and stock of all Kinds my house  
bed and Hitching furniture & all and every other part and parcel  
of my estate after paying the above said sum of fifty dollars &  
also paying and discharging all my just debts which may  
be owing

I constitute and appoint my brothers Devery Bottow and Thomas  
Pettibone my whole and sole Executors to this my last will &  
testament revoking & disannulling all other Wills heretofore made  
Witness my hand and seal this second day of March Anno Domini  
eight hundred and thirteen
