I do nominate and appoint my friend Benjamin Bradshaw  
 Junr as my whole and sole executor to this my last  
 will and Testament revoking all others heretofore by me  
 made In witness I do hereunto set my hand and seal this  
 12<sup>th</sup> Day of April 1814 —
