I Henry Gray of the County of Southampton being in my
perfect senses do make Constitue and appoint this to be my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following —
I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Martha D R Gray
all my estate both real and personal for and during the term of her
natural life or widowhood, upon Condition that with the same
she doth Support and give to my infant Son a Classical Education
in case my wife should marry, it is my will and desire that from
the period of her Marriage she should have and enjoy but one half
of my real and personal estate for and during her life —
I give devise and bequeath unto my infant Child all my estates
real and personal after the death of my beloved wife and in
case my wife should marry, it is my will and desire that the
other half of my estate which will remain after the apportionment
of one half to her for and during her natural life, should be
immediately possessed and enjoyed by my said infant Child
It is my will and desire that as part of my estate, Except my
Shop of vanities, medicines & Surgical Instruments should be
sold, unless it should be found necessary to do so for the purpose
of paying debts —
I hereby Constitue and appoint my beloved wife Martha,
guardian to my Son, so long as she remains single, and in Case
she should marry — It is then my wish that my brother Thomas
Gray and my friend James Rochelle, should be and act as guard
ians to my said Son —
I hereby nominate and appoint my friend James Rochelle Con-
- stitor to this my last will and Testament, and in Case the said
James Rochelle should die before my said Son should
attain the age of twenty years, I then nominate and appoint
my brother Thomas Gray and my nephews Edward and James
Gray, to act from the period of the death of the said James
