

At a court held for the County of Southampton the 20th day of June 1814 This will was presented in Court by the Executor therein named. Proved by the Oaths of Thomas Camp and Benjⁿ Hoies, the Witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of Samuel Calvert the executor therein named who made oath according to law. Costly certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form who gave bond and Security whereupon &c —

In the Name of god amen I James B Wommack of Southampton County and State of Virginia do hereby make my last will and Testament, in manner and form following (that is to say) —

1st I desire that as much of my perishable Estate be sold —
 1^{stly} sold after my decease as will pay my Just debts and funeral expences, Should the perishable part of my property prove insufficient for the above purposes, then I desire that my executor hereafter named, may sell as much of my real estate as will satisfy such debts as shall remain unpaid — 2^{dy} After the payment of my debts and funeral expences, I leave my wife Mary Wommack all the Land and plantation wherein I now live on the North Side of the Cosway Branch, also five negroes Namely Jack, Abraham, Jerry, Seloy, and Arny, also my household and kitchen furniture except two feather beds and one Desk also two bay Mares, five Choice Cows and five head of Sheep and two Sows and pigs and Ten Pheasants with all the plantation Utensils on During their Natural Life, and after her decease, the same to my two Children John Wommack and Sincy Smith to be equally divided between them — except the land I lent to my wife Mary, It is my will and desire that the whole of the land and plantation may descend to my Son John Wommack to him and his heirs forever

3^{rdly} I give to my son John Wommack two negro boys namely John and Arthur to him and his heirs forever —
