I. Ephraim Gee of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia do make this for my last will and Testament my first wish is that my debts be honestly paid to which end I subject my whole estates, I do not wish my negroes to be Subjected to a public Sale where any Tyrant would be at liberty to bid them off and make them the Subjects of his inhumanity, I give to George B Edmunds my whole Estate during his life, I give to my friend James Jackson after the death of George B Edmunds, my negro man Ned to him and his heirs forever — I give to Florence Turner, after the death of George B Edmunds the Whole of my estate both real and personal to her and her heirs forever I appoint George B Edmunds my Executor, and that he act in all respects for the best — Regardless of Penalties in Testimony of which I hereunto set my hand and Seal this fourteenth day of April one thousand and eight hundred and fourteen —
