In the name of god amen I Heneha M'Clenny of Southampton County State of Virginia being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory I thank be to almighty God for the same, (and calling to mind the mortality of my body) and knowing it is appointed for all to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament. First of all I desire that all my Debts and funeral charges be paid and discharged -

Item I leave to my Wife Rhoda M'Clenny the whole of my Land and personal estate, during her Life or widowhood and if she marry, I leave to her the third part of my personal estate -

Item I give to my son Heneha G. M'Clenny the land and plantation where on I now live, containing one hundred and thirty four acres to him and his heirs forever - but if he should die without heirs I give it to his brother James R. M'Clenny -

Item I give to my son James R. M'Clenny the other half of my land containing one hundred and thirty four acres to him and his heirs forever - but if he should die without heirs I give it to his brother Heneha G. M'Clenny -

Item I give to my Daughter Polly M'Clenny one bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever -

Item I give to my daughter Peggy M'Clenny one bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever -

Item I give to my Daughter Rhoda M'Clenny one bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever -

My wife and desire that after the death or marriage of my wife that my executor doth equally divide my property then remaining between my five Children namely Heneha G. M'Clenny James R. M'Clenny Polly M'Clenny Peggy M'Clenny and Rhoda M'Clenny. I likewise do nominate and appoint my wife Rhoda M'Clenny and Anselm Daughtry, Executor and executor of this my last will and Testament given under my hand and Seal this 8<sup>th</sup> day of November one thousand eight hundred and thirteen -

At a court held for the County of Southampton the 27<sup>th</sup> day of February 1814 the will was presented in Court by the Executors provided by the will of Jonathan Robinson and John Fowler two of the Witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of Rhoda M'Clenny the executrix therein named (she being allowed for the executor to qualify) who made oath according to Law - certificate is granted her for obtaining a probate thereof in any form she may see fit and Security Whereupon R. M'Clenny at a Court held for the said County the 1<sup>st</sup> day of Aug<sup>r</sup> 1814 the Certificate to this will was also provided by J. Robinson and ordered to be recorded.
