Item— I give and bequeath unto my Nephew Benjamin Bradshaw all the remainder part of my estate of every kind, my real standing debts and every part and species of my property whatsoever to him and his heirs forever, after paying my just debts out of the whole of my Property—

Item I do nominate and appoint my friend Benjamin Griffin as my whole and sole executor to this my Last will and Testament revoking all others heretofore by me made. In Witness I do hereunto set my hand and seal, this 5th day of December in the year of our Lord Christ, one thousand eight hundred and sixteen
