And I do nominate and appoint my friend Benjamin Griffin as my whole and sole executor to this my last will and testament revoking all other testifies by me made. In witness I do hereunto set my hand and seal, the 5th day of December in the year of our Lord Christ, one thousand Eight hundred and fortynine

I left unto Fanny a Negroe girl, born the Property of Maj C Thomas Vaughan, and was emancipated by the said Thomas Vaughan, which is on record, all the Land that I am possessed of, also one feather bed and furniture. I also left the above mentioned Fanny my negro man Jim.
