

I give to my son Pardee one negro boy Tom and two hundred Dollars to him and his heirs forever, and should he die before he is of lawful age, then the said Negro and two hundred Dollars, to go to my son Jacob to him and his heirs forever, I also give him one horse, saddle and bridle, to him and his heirs forever.

I give to my son Jacob's after my wife's death, the Land and Mill whereon I now live and one negro man Charles to him and his heirs forever, but if he should die before he comes to lawful age, then I give the said Mill Land, Mill and negro after my wife's Death, to my son Pardee to him and his heirs forever.

I lend to my wife Milly, all my estate both real and personal except the negro due to my Daughter Lydia) to her during her life, and after her death it is my desire that all my property not before mentioned, be equally divided between all my children.

I constitute and appoint my wife Milly, Executrix, and my friend Matthew Gardner executor to this my Last Will and Testament this 7<sup>th</sup> day of December 1808

At a Court held for the County of  
Southampton the 20<sup>th</sup> day of  
February 1815 his Will was  
presented in Court by Matthew Gardner the executor therein  
named, (the executrix refusing to qualify) proved by the  
oaths of Noel Waddell and Benjamin Bradshaw—two  
of the Witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded—  
And on the motion of Matthew Gardner the executor  
therein named who made oath according to Law  
a Certificate is granted him for attaining a probat thereof  
in due form who gave bond and Security whereupon &c.
