

James M'Kinley of the State of Kentucky, but in case the said Sale should not be effected I then give to my said Son Thomas one half of the said Lands to him and to his heirs forever
 Item I also give to my said Son and acquit him from all claim and demand of unto the money which I paid to John Wright Esq; in consideration of a Tract of Land, purchased by my said Son Thomas, of the said Abroster, and for which said Land the said Wright made to my said Son Thomas a conveyance which is recorded in Southampton County Court
 Item I give and devise to my son Francis Ridley at the death of his mother all the estate of every kind, I have Lent to her also all the residue of my Lands lying on the south side of the main road leading from Jerusalem to Belvedere, together with all the Slaves and their future increase, that are on the said Lands, as also all other and every species of property which may be on the said Lands excepting the sum made to his Mother during her life to him and his heirs from me
 Item I also give and devise to my said Son Francis one half the proceeds of the sale of my Lands lying in the State of Ohio, which said Lands I have Constitutionally sold to James M'Kinley in the State of Kentucky but in case the said sale should not be effected, I then give to my said Son Francis one half of the aforesaid Lands to him and to his heirs forever —

Item I give and devise to my son Francis all the residue of my estate, be it of what nature or kind soever, to him and to his heirs forever —

Lastly I will and direct that my Sons Thomas Ridley and Francis Ridley shall pay out of the estate willd and devise to them each an equal portion of all my just debts, that is to say my son Thomas shall pay one half, and my son Francis shall pay the other half of my just debts, and I do appoint my sons Thomas and Francis, Executors to this my last will and testament, and I further Direct, that my Sons should not be compelled to give security for their executorial proceeding and that estate be not appraised, Testimony of this writing being my Last will and Testament I have affix my seal and set my hand this third day of December 1809 — Sealed, published and declared as and for the testament and Last will of Thomas Ridley Junr. in presence of —
