William Bittle of the County of Southampton  
in the parish and Bokes of St. Lukes, being weak in body, but sound in mind  
and memory, doth make this my last will and testament in manner and  
form following to wit.

Item - I leave to my loving wife Nancy Bittle my home plantation where  
on I live, during her life; also I leave to my wife the tract of land  
I bought of Thomas Vaughan, until my son John Bittle arrives to the  
age of eighteen; also I leave to my wife Nancy Bittle during her natural  
life the whole of my furniture which is in my manor house; also  
I give to my wife fifty barrels Corn, two horses, old and young mares and  
the young bay mare, three Sons and Daughters, of her choice, three Lambs  
and Calves of her choice, Eighteen far hogs of her choice; also one  
third part of my negroes during her natural life the balance of  
my negroes to be held out until my son John Bittle arrives to  
the age of eighteen and then an equal division of my negroes  
amongst my three children, Charlotte Bittle, Mary Ann Bittle  
and John Bittle, to them and their heirs forever - then at that time  
my son John Bittle shall be put in possession of his estate  
I give and bequeath unto my son John Bittle the whole of  
my lands to him and his heirs forever, to be possessed with all the  
time he arrives to the age of eighteen years, all except the  
manor Plantation which I have left to my wife during her  
life, and at her death to my son John Bittle and his heirs forever  
The balance of my estate to be sold and the money arising  
from the sale, to be equally divided amongst my three children  
Charlotte Bittle, Mary Ann Bittle and John Bittle to them and  
their heirs forever - Lastly I constitute and appoint my  
wife Nancy Bittle, and my friend Nathan Harry Collector  
and executor to this my last will and testament in testimony  
whereof I have hereunto set hand and seal this 31<sup>st</sup> day of  
December 1814 -

Novel Harry 3 At a Court held for the County of Southampton  
Samuel Francis 3 the 20<sup>th</sup> day of July 1815 this will was presented in Court  
by the executor therein named, proved by the oath of Novel Harry one of the  
witnesses thereto, and as a Court held for the County of Southampton the 20<sup>th</sup> day of  
March 1815 Novel Harry deposed to the hand writing of Sam Francis  
the other witness thereto, and is said to be recorded and on the motion of Nathan  
Harry, for administration with the Will annexed, who makes such according to law  
the same is granted him who gave bond and security abovesigned to
