

2nd My Will and desire is that the balance of the Negroes, except the young ones, with their clothing, shall be sold, also the Land and Plantation on Duckhorn and the money arising from the sales to be put to sale to be equally divided among all my Children, respectively as they may come of age.

3rd After the death of my wife, my will and desire is that all the property about to her, of every description be sold and equally divided between my Children as before stated.

4th The Land which Maj. Warham now lives on and stands in my name I give to him and his heirs forever I desire that my Friends Benjamin Blunt Comr. William Blow and Richard Blow, will be my executors, and see this my Last will and Testament Executed, Witness with my own hand and subscribed in Norfolk this 5th day of September one thousand eight hundred and four.

Henry Blow Esq.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 16th day of January 1815, this writing purporting to be the Testament and Last will of Henry Blow dec., was presented in Court by Rich. Blow one of the executors therein named, and George Gaily and James Rockella, being sworn depose that they believe the body of said Writing as well as the Signatures thereto, to be in the proper hand writing of him the said Henry. Therefore it is ordered that the same be established as his Last will and Testament and recorded, and the said Richard Blow one of the executors named in said Will, refusing in open Court to qualify as such, therefore on the motion of the said Richard, who made oath according to Law for administration with the Will annexed, the same is granted him as giving bond and Security whereupon &c. and at a Court held for the County of Southampton the 28th day of February 1816, Benjamin Blunt another of the Executors named in said will, personally appeared in Court, and refusing to qualify as such, therefore on the motion of said Benjamin, who made oath according to Law &c.
