Item I give to my son Thomas Pethlow four hundred dollars in addition to what I have advanced him —

Item I give to my son Joshua Pethlow four hundred dollars in addition to what I have advanced him —

Item I give to my son John Pethlow eighteen hundred dollars in addition to what I have advanced him —

Item I give unto my son Joseph Pethlow the tract of land I bought of Josiah Davis together with a part of the tract I have on comprehensive within the following bounded way: beginning at the upper corner of said Davis tract adjoining the land I have on from thence along the line between myself and Edward Bailey to a stake called the Pond branch thence down said Branch to the previous branch thence up said previous branch by a line of marked trees to a corner thence along a line of marked trees to Byers Howells line thence north along E. Howells line to George Baileys line thence along said George Baileys line to a corner of said Josiah Davis tract by Nancy and Edward Baileys lines to the beginning. I further give to my son Joseph two beds and their furniture 3 horse beds and Trundle and twenty four hundred dollars all these bequests I make to my son Joseph and his heirs forever —

Item I give to my son Robert Pethlow and his heirs forever the plantation in Southampton on which I live with the except-
-ion of the part heretofore devised to my son Joseph. I also give to my son Robert one bed and furniture and twelve hundred dollars

Item I give to my son Amos B. Pethlow three thousand five hundred dollars —

Item I give to my daughter Mary Pethlow three thousand five hundred dollars —

Item It is my desire that the remainder of my estate may be equally divided between all my children
