Item 1st I give and bequeath to my brother Michael Harris (now to his heirs forever) and assigns forever the sum of two hundred dollars to be paid out of the bonds I have against my said brother (and that he should not pay any interest on the said bonds after my decease)

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my friend Abraham Smith & to his heirs and assigns forever the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars for him to dispose of as he thinks proper

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my loving mother Elizabeth Mundell my lands and possessions lying in the county of Southampton to her and her heirs and assigns forever also all the residue of my estate of every kind whatsoever by me possessed after paying my just debts to her and her heirs and assigns forever

I do hereby nominate and appoint my friend Abraham Smith my whole and sole executor to this my last will and testament (and it is my will and desire that the court let him qualify without giving any security for the performance of the same)
