dollars to be paid out of the bonds I have against my said brother  
and that he should not pay any interest on the said bonds after  
my decease -

Item 2<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to my friend Abram Smith &  
to his heirs and assigns forever the sum of one hundred and  $\frac{1}{2}$  dollars  
for him to dispose of as he thinks proper -

Item 3<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to my loving mother Elizabeth  
Mundall my lands and possessions lying in the county of  
Southampton to her and her heirs and assigns forever also  
all the residue of my estate of every kind whatsoever by me  
possessed after paying my just debts to her and her heirs and  
assigns forever -

Item 4 I nominate and appoint my friend Abram Smith my  
whole and sole executor to this my last will and testament  
and it is my will and desire that the court let him gildify  
without giving any security for the performance of the same
