children the whole of my estate then remaining between my
four children one fourth of which I lend to my daughter Elizabeth

divided between my other three children Sabatha Fowler
Joannah Fowler and James Fowler the other three fourths of my
property to be equally divided between my three last mentioned
children —

I likewise nominate and appoint my friend John Fowler
son of William Fowler and my wife Sabatha Fowler the whole
and sole executors of this my last will and testament given under
my hand & seal this 20th day of January 1814 —
