to die and wishing to dispose of my Estate to my own satisfaction do make and  
again this my last will and testament in manner and form following  
Item I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Caroline Matthews Kellow  
one negro woman named Lucy and her increase to her and her heirs forever  
but in case of her dying without an heir then to her Eldest sister if there  
is a sister but in case there should be no sister to have an heir then  
my will and desire is that the legacy deared to Henry Burgess Wells and  
his heirs I also give with the above legacy my Chest of Drawers  
Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Matthews Kellow all my wearing  
apparel - Item I give to my son Abbigdon Samuel Hensley Burgess  
five negroes to wit Charles Preston Albert Susan and Patsy with their  
Increase to him and his heirs forever - Item I give to my grand son Henry  
Burgess Kellow one horse saddle and bridle - Item I give and bequeath  
to my grand son William Overton Wells one horse saddle and bridle  
Item My will and desire is that my negro woman Annahy be left to her  
self if the laws of the state will admit of it if not that she have the  
liberty of choosing who she will live with my will and desire is that  
my son Abbigdon Samuel Hensley Burgess possess all the residue of my  
Estate not heretofore mentioned of what nature or kind soever wheare  
and whensoever found that is to say two feather beds and furniture  
half a dozen of Table spoons half a dozen tea do one large silver spoon  
diner Forks two silver salt Cellars - and lastly I do appoint my son  
Abbigdon Samuel Hensley Burgess whole and sole Executor of this  
my last will and testament - Witness my hand and seal this  
twenty second of August one thousand eight hundred and twelve
