and my negro man Isaac.

I then give to my daughter Polly Synner one bed and furniture

I then give to my daughter Sally Boykin one bed and furniture

I then give to my daughter Nancy Whitney one bed and furniture

My Will and desire is that all the balance of my Estate shall be equally
divided amongst my three daughters Polly Synner, Sally Boykin and

Sally Whitney and my wife Polly Whitney

I nominate and appoint my friends Levi Rivers and Jesse Lankford my
Executors to this my last will and testament as Witness my hand and seal
this 2nd of December 1814

My wish is that my negro man Tom should have the privilege of choosing
him a Master at the sale of said Negro
