

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 16th day of October 1815 This Will and testament of Richard Blaw deceased was produced in Court by John Thomas and James Rochelle the Executors therein named and there being no witnesses to the said will George Gurley and James Kello were sworn and severally deposed that they are well acquainted with the testators hand writing and verily believe the said will and the name thereof subscribed to be wholly written by the testators own hand Whereupon the said will is ordered to be recorded And on the motion of the said Executors who made oath thereto and together with George Gurley their security entered into and acknowledge a bond in the penalty of ten thousand dollars Conditioned as the law directs Certificate is granted them for obtaining a probat thereof in due form

In the name of god amen I John Wallons of the County of Southampton being in a low state of health at present in body but in my usual senses and memory do make and ordain this my last will & testament in manner and form as follows to wit, -
I give unto my wife Delitha Wallons the use of one feather bed furniture two cows and calves two sheep the first choice of horses also six and pigs and six shoats the first choice also two pots and looks one patch oven and employing pawns for or during her life or widowhood and after her death or marriage I give the same to my son Matthew Wallons to him and his heirs forever -
I now My will and desire is for my Ex^{or} to sell as much of my land and plantation as shall be sufficient to pay my debts with the remainder of my other Estate and the remainder of my lands I give to my son Matthew Wallons to him and his heirs forever -
I now I also do appoint my friend James Bond my whole and sole Executor to this my last will and testament. Witness my hand and seal this the 27th day of June 1815 -
