 of Virginia being a little indisposed in body but in perfect mind and
 memory and calling to mind that all men must and having left a
 wife to leave I am willing that mine should be given as follows
 After my funeral Expenses settled &c &c and paid I give to Jacob Barnes
 Post Master all my wearing apparel Chest Books &c &c
 belonging to me to the said Jacob Barnes own disposal forever
 I likewise give to the said Jacob Barnes all monies that may be due
 me for schooling or any Contracts made should there be any to his own use
 Furthermore as it is customary in these parts for a funeral sermon to
 be preached over the deceased & as I have a full belief as much as any
 man in the holy Scriptures my will and desire in this case is that my
 body may be laid away in a decent manner as circumstances may
 permit without any Ceremony or preaching Except any steady man or
 preacher would be hard enough to read the burial of the dead
 when the Corps are laid away - Furthermore I desire and appoint the
