and parish of Stuttonway being in perfect health and of sound mind &
memory but calling to mind the certainty of death and the uncertainty
of that time it may happen I make and ordain this my last will &
testament in manner and form following *Rebecca Duggs*

After the 1st I give to my sister Frances Calvert the following Regiments
Sarah Carter Lincol and Antionelle with their future increases to her
and her heirs forever

Steno 2nd I give to my niece Malissa Frances Lott one negro boy named Ben and sleeping table and one looking to her and her heirs forever.

Stur 3rd Give to my niece Catherine Mary Cobb one negro boy named
Harrison to her and her heirs

Item 2^d I give to my niece Anne Rebecca Cobb one negr boy named
Reuben one Burand and one looking glass to her and her heirs
for the living and the heirs of the said Anne Rebecca Cobb

Item 5th I give to my friend Isaac's Rebecca Permy one negro boy
named Peter and one negro girl named Marinda one feather bed and
furniture with future increase of Marinda to her and her heirs
the 1st of June 1790

Item 6th I give to my friend Nancy Nichols on three hundred dollars in
cash to her and her heirs.

Item 7th After my just debts and funeral Expenses are paid It is my wish and desire that all that part of my Estate not heretofore devised and given away of every kind and greatly be equally divided between my Nieces Frances Rebecca Deany and Anne Rebecca Lobb to them and their heirs forever

Lastly I nominate and appoint my sister Frances Calvert and Mary
Purges whole and sole executrices of this my last will and testament,
and it is my will and desire that they retain all the legacies
heretofore given away in their own hands until the legacies are
paid or shall arrive at lawful age or marry and have let likewise
their power at any time they see fit to advance any part of the said
legacies that they shall think proper and necessary for the mainte-
nance or support agreeable to their own discretions I do not wish
my Executors to be oblig'd to give security for their administration

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 20th day of November 1788
This Will was proved by the oaths of John Pinner and James Kellars two of the
Witnesses thereto and was read to be recorded And on the motion of the Defendant
her husband one of the Executors therein named who made oath according
to law the Certificate is signed and granted her for obtaining a probat thereof in due
form, the Will admitting no security to be taken (duty being reserved
to the other Executors to Qualify)
