I Sarah Stanton of Southampton County being sick and weak of body bed of a
despairing mind do make and avow this my last will and testament in manner
and form following to wit
I give and bequeath unto James Stanton my brother all my share in
the mill known by the name of the lightwood mill and my riding chair to
him his heirs and assigns forever
I leave the tract of land whereon Sarah Butler at present resides after her
decease to be sold by my Executors hereafter named and the money arising therefrom
to be appropriated to the special purpose of purchasing land in the State of Ohio
or else where as they in their wisdom may see more advisable equally for the
two shares of my brother James Stanton namely Elwood & Charles Stanton
to them and their heirs forever

I then After paying my just debts the residue of my Estate of what nature or
kind soever I give and bequeath Equally to the said & between my two brothers
James Stanton before named and John Stanton to them and their heirs and assigns
forever

I then Innominate and appoint James and John Stanton of persons my true & lawful
Executors to this my last will and testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this twentieth day of the month monthe eighteen then
and said then
