I Benjamin Lewis of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia do make and constitute this to be my last will and testament, as follows
 First I give to my wife Deborah Lewis all my Estate both real and personal during her life or widowhood after the payment of my just debts provided she will educate and support all my children in a proper manner without charging them for their board - And in case my wife shall Marry I bid her the land near the Cross roads I bought of Nathaniel Foster and at her death to be equally divided between all my sons namely Zebulon Lewis Benjamin W. Lewis and James Lewis also my negroes Beck, Elariah and Nelly with their increase which negroes and increase I wish to be equally divided among my children at the death of my wife
 Now It is my will that all the balance of my land be equally divided between my three sons Zebulon Lewis Benjamin W. Lewis and James Lewis at the death or marriage of my wife - at the death of my wife the land I bound her as above stated be also included in the division to them and their heirs forever provided they will support my daughters in a decent manner until they are married -
