In the name of god amew I Robert Williams of Southampton
 County state of Virginia being in a low state of health but sound
 and under memory thanks be to god for the same do make and ordain
 this to be my last will and testament. I leave my body to be buried
 my soul to Almighty god that gave it me touching my worldly goods
 after my lawful debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate
 the residue I dispose of as follows. I will a tract or parcel of land
 apart of the tract that I now live on beginning at a post oak standing
 at the corner of an old field on the side of the mile path thence
 straight line to three walnut trees standing close together back of my
 orchard thence a straight line to a walnut tree on the side of the
 branch the line between me and Mr. Stephenson thence down the
 said branch to the mill swamp thence up the mill swamp to
 Thomas Newson's line thence Newson's line to the first station
 To my son John Williams and his heirs forever the residue of my
 lands I will to my son Rob Williams to him and his heirs forever
 only a piece I leave for the benefit of my three daughters namely
 Polly Williams, Melly Williams and Cliff Williams during their
 single lives I will to them the following land beginning at a maple
 in the branch next to Nancy Stephens and thence down Stephens
 line to another branch thence up the branch to a old field thence
 down a cart path to the first station I will to my son William
 Williams Rose Coll - I give to my daughter Polly Williams one
 feather bed and furniture - I give to my daughter Melly Williams one
 feather bed and furniture - I give to my daughter Cliff Williams one
 feather bed and furniture - the residue of my estate of all kinds
 whatever I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth Williams to her and
 her heirs forever I nominate and appoint my wife and my son William
 Williams my sole and sole executors to this my last will & testament
 this 23rd day of August 1815
