

Agreeable to an order of the County Court of Southampton bearing date December 1815 directing an assignment by the master Commissioner of the Estate of Richard Blow deceased formerly in the hands of John & Blow acting Executor And also to settle the said John & Blow guardianship accounts with the orphans of said Richard Blow deceased - The Master Commissioner after giving due notice to the parties concerned to attend at his office in Jerusalem has proceeded to settle and adjust the said account current and finds that the Estate of Richard Blow is indebted to the said Executor the sum of £ 8.15.6 But in adjusting the guardianship accounts of the said John & Blow with the said orphans of Richard Blow deceased find the said John & Blow indebted to them severally to wit - To Thomas Blow see guardianship acct stated up to the year 1800 the sum of £ 22.11.8

and also the proportion of £ 23.9.6 which was in the hands of John & Blow being the estate of Benj^r Blow dec^d who was brother of the whole blood to Thomas Blow

To James Blow in the guardianship acct. £ 9.7.7
His proportion of Benj^r Blow's Est he being of the whole blood 7.16.6 14.6.1
To Peter Blow in the guardianship acct. 32.0.6

His proportion of Benj^r Blow's Est he being of the whole blood 7.16.6 33.18.9
Richard Day in right of his deceased mother formerly Nancy Blow on guardianship account } 7.8.10

His proportion of Benj^r Blow's Estate his said mother being a sister of the half blood } 3.18.3 11.2.1

The following sums are to be deducted from each of the said Wards claims being their proportion of £ 8.15.6 the balance due to John & Blow on the account current to wit -

From Thomas Blow his proportion of £ 22.3.10 1/2

Which will then leave to him due from J & Blow the sum of £ 27.9.3 1/2

From James Blow his proportion of £ 15.6 the sum of 2.3.10 1/2

Which will then leave to him due from J & Blow 12.2.2 1/2

From Peter Blow his proportion of £ 8.15.6 the sum of 2.3.10 1/2

Which will then leave to him due from J & Blow 33.14.10 1/2

From Richard Day his proportion of £ 8.15.6 the sum of 2.3.10 1/2

Which will then leave to him due from J & Blow £ 8.15.6

Thus then it will appear that the Estate of John & Blow deceased who acted as guardian to the said Orphans is indebted as above stated the several sums annexed to their names amounting to eighty two pounds three shillings and six pence viz £ 82.6
