Tylphugh, Ann Eliza Tylphugh, (and John Henry Tylphugh) do equally divide
my personal property whatever they become of age, or marry (and the
said property to belong to him and their heirs forever —

Then, I say (wife) Nancy Tylphugh should think proper to marry, then
the above named property shall be disposed of in manner and form following
Then, For my wife to have one third part of the above named property
and the other two thirds of my property, except the Land to be equally divided
between my Children namely, Matthew T. Tylphugh, Rebecca Tylphugh
Ann Eliza Tylphugh, (and John Henry Tylphugh). —

And I do hereby constitute (and appoint) (Drewry Waller (and Thomas
Tylphugh Executors to this my last Will and testament, In witness whereof

names who made oaths thereto (and together with Drewry Waller (and
Benjamin Appewhite his securities interceded and acknowledged a bond
in the penalty of twenty thousand dollars (and in and to the said Court
certainly is granted the said Thomas Tylphugh for obtaining a probate
thereof in due form —
