In the name of God Amen I Edith Washington being Sick in body, but perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for the same - and knowing that it is once appointed for all persons to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following. First of all I give and bequeath my soul unto Almighty God who gave it me & my body to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my executor - I give and bequeath unto my grandson Henry Johnston, one serrel mare & her colt (called his) one bridle and saddle, one feather bed and furniture, one cow and calf, one small gun to him this heirs forever - I give and bequeath unto my ~~son~~ grandson Matthew Washington one feather bed and furniture which I have previously lent to my daughter Christy Spivy to him and his heirs forever - I desire and say that the residue of my estate (of what soever kind or nature shall be sold & divided as follows to wit) I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lucy Bledger one sixth part of the monies arising from such sale of my estate, to her & to her heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Chlo. Boosman one sixth part of the monies arising from the sales of my estate, to her & to her heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my grandchildren Nancy Whitehead, Elizabeth Whitehead, James Whitehead, & Putney Whitehead, one sixth part of the monies arising from the sales of my estate to them & to their heirs forever (equally) I lend unto my daughter Sally Braby one half one sixth part of the monies arising from the sales of my estate, during her natural life and after the death of my daughter Sally to be equally between my grandchildren Washington I Johnston Eli^a Johnston & Benjamin Johnston to them & to their heirs forever.
