But in case my said grand son Henry Johnstone shall die without lawful issue then in that case all the property herein before mentioned & given to him the said Henry shall be equally divided between my grand children ^{Washington} Johnstone & Benjamin Johnstone to them and to their heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my grand son ^{Matthew} Washington one sixth part of the monies arising from the sale of my Estate to him & to his heirs forever. And in case he my said grand son shall die without lawful issue then it is to be equally divided between all my grand children then living. Lastly I constitute and appoint my friend James Whitehead my sole and sole executor to this my last will & testament.
