

James Millar of Southampton County being at this time of
 sound mind and disposing memory do make and ordain this to
 be my last will and testament in manner and form following
 To wit. Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my son James
 Millar the tract of land and plantation I bought of Capt.
 Nathaniel Brush lying in the forks of Buckhorn containing
 three hundred and thirty three acres, by the same more or
 less, together with the still and all other appurtenances belong-
 ing thereto, to him and to his heirs forever.
 My will and desire is that all the property which I have here-
 before delivered to my three children respectively, be considered
 as given to them, as fully, as if it was again herein repeated
 and do hereby bequeath it to them and their heirs forever.
 I give and bequeath to my son James Millar my negro girl born called
 Sally to him and to his heirs forever. My will and desire is,
 that my land called Plants tract which I bought of Capt. Nathaniel
 Brush containing about two hundred & fifty acres, be the same more
 or less, may be sold by my Ex^{or} or adm^r, as the case may be on
 a credit of nine or twelve months, or for cash if thought
 practicable, for payment of my just debts, together with what money
 may be due me, and what can be spared from the growing crops
 leaving a sufficiency, for the consumption of the surviving family.
 I lend to my wife Martha Millar during her natural life the
 land and plantation whereon I now live together with my still
 and boiler, and at her death I give and bequeath the said land
 still & boiler to my son James Millar to him and his heirs
 forever. My will and desire is that my negroes not herein
 devised may be by commissioners appointed by the court, divided
 into two equal parts as near as may be, the choice of one such
 equal part I lend to my wife Martha Millar, during her
 natural life, and at her death I give and bequeath them with
 their increase to be equally divided between my daughters Martha
 Sumner Stewart & Sarah called Sally Eliza Brush if living at
 my death to them and to their heirs forever, and the remaining
 equal part I give and bequeath to be equally divided between my
 two daughters Martha Sumner Stewart & Sarah called Sally Eliza
 Brush if living at my death to them and their heirs forever.
 But in case of the death of either or both at my death then to
 the legal heirs of their body to them and to their heirs forever.
 I give and bequeath to my wife Martha Millar all my household
 and kitchen furniture, all my plantations utensils, all my stock of hogs
 cattle, sheep & dogs, with the provisions as laid in for the family
 consumption, and a sufficient support from the growing crops for her
 and her heirs forever, also my riding chair and harness also my carriage
 and harness to her and to her heirs forever. Lastly I nominate
 and appoint my son James Millar and my friend Drury
 Waller Ex^{ors} to this my last will and testament hereby
