My will & desire is that after the death of my wife

My will & desire is that should either of my children die
before arriving to lawful age the surviving child to have the
property of the dead to him & his heirs forever.

Should both of my children Lewis J. Harrell and Allen
B. Harrell die without lawfull heir my will & desire is
that the whole of the property that I have given them
with its increase should descend to my friend Wm J. Smith
which I give to him & his heirs forever except one small
negro which I give to Thomas J. Smith & his heirs forever.

I thought my wife Rebecca hereafter move to this state
of Georgia, and with her Passes is to have my wife Rebecca
should carry with her, my two children Lewis J. Harrell
and Allen B. Harrell also the whole of the property I have
loaned her for the support & education of my two children
And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my friend
Wm J. Smith Executor of this my last will & testament
hereby revoking all former wills or testaments by me
heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & affixed my seal this Twentieth day of March
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
eighty.

-entences proved by the oaths of Joseph J. Claude and Burr Montbrook two of the witnesses
there & ordered to be recorded on the motion of William J. Smith the executor therein
named this case with the oaths and together with Geo. J. Claude and Burr Montbrook his securities
entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars conditioned
that the law since executed is granted the Ransom J. Harrell for obtaining a probate
therein in due form.
