Be it known to all men that I Henry Thomas of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, have agreed to make the following arrangements respecting my property having resolved not to live with my wife any longer. In consequence thereof I have agreed to let her have the plantation whereon I now live during her natural life together with the household and kitchen furniture. I also give her my negro man Amos and another named Charles two negro women Sylvia and Frankie one negro girl named Dice, one negro boy Jesse during her life and if there are any more left after paying my just debt I wish them to be kept on the said plantation for the benefit of my wife and children. The remainder of my land I give to my son Pitt Thomas and his heirs forever after the decease of my wife Jane Thomas my intention is that the plantation which I have lent to her during her life shall be given to my son Pitt Thomas by his paying my daughter Mary J. Thomas one third part of the value of said plantation and my other daughter Maria Thomas one third part. I also appoint my wife Jane Thomas executrix of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this nineteenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and sixteen.
