I William Fowler of the county of I ampton and state of
 Virginia do hereby make my last will & testament in
 manner & form following. Vizt. principally and first
 of all I desire that all my just debts & funeral expenses
 be paid by my Executor hereafter named.

Item I leave to my dearly beloved wife Elizabeth Fowler
 during her singleness or widowhood the following
 property to wit: The small room in my dwelling & ground
 acquired for a garden cotton & potato patch sufficient for
 her two children Fanny and Henry Fowler also one
 negro boy Rodger to be hired out by my exec & the money
 therefor to be applied to her use I also lend her three
 of old army, one bed and furniture one wooden wheel &
 cards one pot and books, three plates one dish and basin
 & three chairs two head of sheep & as much corn pork and
 lard as may be thought sufficient for her & two children
 Fanny and Henry for the first years provision and one
 tuble and frying pan.

Item I give to my son John Fowler my piney woodshed
 containing one hundred and forty two acres more or less
 also one negro man called old Casar I also lend him one
 negro girl called young Amy during his life & the life of
 his wife Patsy Fowler & then the negro girl called young Amy
 that I lent him & wife during their lives I give to my grandson
 William Fowler the son of John Fowler

Item I give to my son William Fowler the plantation I now
 live on with one hundred & eight acres of land & outbuild
 still after the death of my daughter Sally Fowler or marriage of
 her I lend her only that use of part of the dwelling house
 and corn land only sufficient for her own support. I also give him
 one negro boy called Thomas & one negro boy called Jeffery to him
 and his heirs forever

Item I give to my son Joseph Fowler the two negroes he has in his possession
 called Pompey and Sam to him and his heirs forever
