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Then I give to my daughter Fanny Towles all the property lent to my
 wife. After her death or marriage except the one negro boy called
 Redger I also give her an negro called Mussy & girl Harriet to her
 and her heirs forever also the negro boy Tom.

Then I give to my son Henry Fisher this negro, one called Redge
I lent to my wife & one called Champion to him and his things
four labor one negro girl called Hannah.

I will and desire that all the rest of my estate both real and personal of what nature or kind soever it may be not herein particularly mentioned or disposed of to be equally divided by my Executor among my children hereafter mentioned (to wit) John, William, Randolph, Sally, Easter, Matthew, Fanny, and Henry Fowler to them and their heirs forever. & Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son William Fowler and my friend Jordan Edwards execution to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other will or wills heretofore made by me and acknowledging this & this only to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8th day of February 1818.
