In the name of God Amen I Burton Taylor being of sound mind and disposing memory do make and ordain that my last will and testament is as follows. I give unto my wife Sally Taylor during her life or widowhood, the plantation whereon I now live, and also a negro woman, named Tall with her increase after this time, and any or all of my horses she may make choice of.

And I give unto my wife Sally Taylor during her life or widowhood, all of my household and kitchen furniture and plantation utensils, and the stock of hogs on my plantation and also the cattle which I do not hereafter will away.

And at the death or marriage of my wife Sally Taylor I give unto my son Charles Taylor the tract of land whereon I now live to him and his heirs forever.

And at the death or marriage of my wife Sally Taylor I desire that the negro woman Tall with her increase during her life or widowhood, together with her increase from this time, may be equally divided between my two sons James Taylor and Charles Taylor them and their heirs forever.

And I give unto my son James Taylor one cow and calf to him and his heirs forever. I give unto my daughter Nancy Bradley one negro girl named China to her and her heirs forever.

And I give unto grandson James Boston Bradley one cow and calf forever.

And I give to my daughter Elizabeth Jackson one negro girl named Vilet and one cow and calf to her and to her heirs forever.

And I give to my daughter Fanny Taylor one negro boy named Luke to her and to her heirs forever.

And I give to my daughter Patsy Taylor one negro girl named Rose to her and to her heirs forever.

And I give to my son Charles Taylor one colt called Toby to him and to his heirs forever.

And I give to my daughter Mary Chitty one dollar to her and to her heirs forever.

And I give to my grand daughter Nancy Chitty one cow and calf to her and to her heirs forever.

And at the death or marriage of my wife Sally Taylor I give unto my son Charles Taylor and my daughters Fanny Taylor and Patsy Taylor a bed and furniture each, and a cow and calf a piece.

And I desire that the residue of the estate, which I have here disposed of between my children James Taylor, Nancy Bradley, Elizabeth Jackson, Charles Taylor, Fanny Taylor, and Patsy Taylor them and their heirs forever.

And I desire that if my son Charles Taylor should die before he arrives to the age of twenty one years, the property which I have given to him, may be given to my son James Taylor and to his heirs forever.
