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I give to my son Samuel B. Hines a silver watch to be purchased by my executor hereafter named I also give to my said son Samuel B. Hines my beds and furniture, my household and kitchen furniture, all my stock on the plantation, and any debts or debts which in his individual capacity he may owe me.

I give four beds with their furniture to my son William Drow Hines to remain with my son Samuel B. Hines so long as my son William lives with him.

It is my will and desire that the slaves should be kept upon the plantation whereon I now live in case I should die after the first day of March in any year and that to be returned to the persons to whom they are given well clothed at the expense of my son Samuel B. Hines. And no matter at what season of the year I may die I give the provisions laid up for the use of the family and stock upon the plantation and the growing crop and plantations stands to my son Samuel B. Hines. I give when debts of furniture mentioned in the bequest to my son William D. Hines to my son Robert Hines.

I give and bequeath unto my grandson Henry M. Gray one thousand Dollars. In case my said grandson should die under the age of twenty one years and without leaving children I give the said one thousand dollars to my daughter Martha F. B. Rockwell and her heirs, but in case she should die without leaving children then I give the same to my four sons or the descendants of such of them as may be dead.

The rest and residue of my estate I desire may be applied first to the payment of my debts and then to the payment of the pecuniary legacies herein bequeathed and the balance to be equally divided among all my children thereby nominate, constitute and appoint my son Robert Hines and my friends George Blor and James Rockwell executor of this my last will and testament.

and bequeath the said negro man Andrew to my son George Hines
and his heirs forever.

I revoke so much of my former will as relates to the devise of Old
Jim to my daughter Martha F. B. Rockwell and give devise and bequeath
the said negro man Old Jim to my son William Drow Hines under the like limitations and
