

And if my said son Joseph should die under lawful age or without lawful issue
 I give my wife and devise is in ^{the} said shall all the personal estate which
 I have bequeathed to him, shall be divided amongst my brother and sister
 or their executors in the same proportion that it would by law be
 were he to die intestate and without lawful issue; and each of them parts
 of my said son Joseph should die under age or without lawful heirs
 those to whom my personal estate will go to fulfill what I have requested
 my son Joseph to do if he should not find him it respecting the
 purchase of an hundred dollars worth of land for Susanah Bondy I hope
 they will comply with this request and think not hard of it
 My will and desire is that my executor hereafter named shall be
 the said my guardian to my said son and his Joseph Harris Thorne
 until he shall arrive at lawful age and I hereby appoint him such
 and also keep my estate together as it now stands, without any sale thereof
 and raise money therefrom to pay my debts if possible before my
 said son shall come of age

My wife and devise further is that if the law will justify it there be
 no inventory returned to court or appraisement of my personal
 estate, and that my executor hereafter named and appointed give
 no security for the execution of my will I constitute, nominate
 and appoint my Brother James Harris whole and sole executor
 of this my last will and testament, he witness of all herein
 containing I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twenty sixth
 day of October one thousand eight hundred & ten

At a court held for the county of Hampton the
 19th day of October 1819. This last will and testament of James
 Harris deceased was presented in court proved by the oaths of Joseph
 Hill and one of the subscribing witnesses therein who together
 with James Harris, and Samuel Safford being sworn depone that
 the names of Nathaniel Mabry and David Myrick subscribed a testimony
 to said will (to be in said D. 22) to be in their own proper hand writing
 (Which upon it is ordain that the said will be recorded, James Harris the
 executor therein named pursued in open court to take upon himself the
 discharge of the execution thereof Therefore on the motion of Joseph H.
 Thorne who made oath according to law for administration with the will annexed the
 same is granted him on his giving bond & security whereupon the S. J. P. H. Thorne together
 with James Harris & J. P. Sullivan his co-executors entered into a bond in the penalty
 Twenty thousand Dollars conditioned as the law directs
