Will

I George Jerey of the county of Southampton in the state of Virginia do hereby make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following that (is to say)
1st I give to my Son George Jerey the land and plantation I bought of Benjamin Turner and whereas he now lies also a piece or parcel of the land whereon I now live myself to be taken off in the following manner (to wit) to begin at a Turkey oak a corner of James Harrys land running due South by straight line untill it intersects with Benjamin Blunts Doo which piece or parcel so taken of will join the land whereon my said son now lives also the following negroes David Sampson, Stephen Sina and one and their future increase also the bed and furniture which I sleep on myself and one hundred and fifty dollars to be raised out of my estate by my executor hereafter named all which I give to him and his heirs forever.
2nd I give to my Daughter Sarah I give the following things to wit Dennis, Thomas, Silvia, Ruth and Agatha and their future increase also the household furniture which I have heretofore used to her all which estate I give to her and her heirs forever.
3rd I give to my son John Jerey the land and plantation whereon I now live myself except the part or parcel which I have given to my son George Jerey also the land and plantation I bought of George Mears Robert Mobbs representation also the following negroes Joseph, Ellis, Lucy and Jane and their future increase also my household beds and two feather beds and furniture which now stands up in my house all which estate I give to him and his heirs forever.
4th I give to my grandson William Jerey (Son of Henry) twenty dollars to be paid out of my estate by my executor hereafter named to him and his heirs forever.
5th I give to my grandson Henry Jerey (son of Henry) five hundred and twenty dollars and if my said grandson Henry Jerey should depart this life before he arrives at age I will that my grandson William Jerey shall have the said five hundred and ten dollars and if both of my said grandsons William and Henry Jerey should depart this life before Henry arrives at age I will that the said five hundred dollars be equally divided amongst my own children and I further will that my executor hereafter named shall raise out of my estate and keep in his care a sum of money sufficient to put to interest or so to provide that the principal and interest together shall make the five hundred and ten dollars when my said grandson Henry Jerey arrives at age.
6th My will further is that my children divide my estate and things amongst them equally without sale and the parties plots which I have heretofore advanced to my daughter Sarah I do to be accounted for in her lot in said division and I further will that all my estate not given away in the foregoing part of this will be sold or a reasonable credit by my executor hereafter named and out of the proceeds of such sale to pay first all my just debts and then the before mentioned legacies and the remainder to be equally divided amongst my children.
