In the name of God Amen I Polyrion Wick of the county of Southampton and state of Virginia being very old in body but of sound and of disposing mind and memory thanks to the disposal of all things for the same and knowing that it is the lot of all men to leave this transient life and that not how soon I do therefore under those inspirations which proper to make this my last will and testament in the manner and form following (to wit) First I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Sally Wick two good black bedsteads and furniture on fire shirt (painted) one woman's saddle to be at her disposal forever that is to say to her and to her heirs forever. Secondly I give unto my loving wife Sally Wick eight barrels of corn four hundred pounds of bacon half my stock of hogs four cows two cows & calves one bay mare to be for the use of her and her two children namely Polly & Anna during her natural life or widowhood and thus it is my desire that the two above named Polly and Anna should have the use thereof to them their heirs and assigns forever. Thirdly I give unto my Daughter Polly one bed & bedstead and furniture my bay colt named Scott to her and to her heirs forever. Fourthly I give unto my Daughter Anna my walnut table one bed black stand & furniture on fire shirt (painted) and three twelve pointer plates and twelve pointer spoons to be equally divided between Polly and Anna. Fifthly I give unto my daughter Catharine Hargrave Ten Dollars to be raised out of my estate. Sixthly I give unto my son Eason my Duke to him and his heirs forever. Seventhly I give unto my daughter Patience Wick one bed & bedstead and furniture one table call^d cherry wood the dining and fork which she has in possession the bed she to the one which she has now in possession. Eighthly I give unto my son Samuel Wick my shot gun to him and his heirs forever. Ninthly I give all the land whereon I now live unto my two Daughters namely Polly and Anna Wick to them and their heirs forever my loving wife Sally to have the use thereof during her natural life or widowhood.
