I Henry Obury of Southampton county Virginia do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows (to wit) That I give devise and bequeath to my two youngest sons Alfred and Henry Obury all my lands and plantations whereon I now live to be divided between them by a line which was made for that purpose some time past by Joshua Seiner, Elijah Soyner and myself to stand as a dividing line between them, and I Henry to have the part where the house stands, this I give to them and their heirs forever provided they live to have lawful heir, but if either of them should die without lawful heir my will and devise is that the whole should be divided. I also give and bequeath to my son Alfred Obury one feather bed and furniture one pair table one pair chest one cotton pick and six plates three barrels and a half of corn one cow and one bullock to him and his heirs forever. I also give and bequeath to my son Henry Obury one bed and furniture one painted chest one worship dish and six plates one pair fire iron & two iron pots two plough two winding bars one grubbing bar & one and all my cooper's tools & one plough frame one cart bay mare bridled &c
