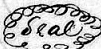

Quinton Barnes 

At a Court Held for the County of Southampton the 15th day of
October 1815

This last will and Testament was proved by the oaths
of Samuel Turner and Nathaniel Jones sons of the testator's heirs and
together with the evidence shown under being sworn by the oaths of Henry
Foster and Samuel Turner sons of the testator's heirs and ordered to be recor-
ded and on the motion of William H. Barnes the executor therein named
who made oath thereto and together with Samuel Turner and William
Phillips his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty
of ten thousand Dollars for the 15 day of November 1815 entered into with
Jesse D. Pace his securities and acknowledged another bond in the
penalty of five thousand dollars both conditioned as the law
and certificate is granted the said William H. Barnes
for obtaining a probate thereof in due form
